Who Cares? Scotland is committed to supporting Care Experienced people's educational aspirations. To help achieve this aim, we're offering two scholarships to members aged 16-18 to attend **Harvard Summer School, Secondary School Program.**

We believe all people should be able to achieve their educational goals regardless of the barriers they may face. Care Experienced people can encounter systematic challenges, including the tides of poverty and frequent placement moves between schools.

We want to offset these difficulties by providing a Care Experienced person with a first-rate educational opportunity at a world-renowned university.

The Program runs from **Saturday 21 June to Saturday 9 August 2025** and takes place on the Harvard campus in Cambridge, Massachusetts, USA just north of Boston. Participants in the Summer School Program spend seven weeks at Harvard, studying two university level academic courses and taking part in campus life.

Who Cares? Scotland has been involved in the Harvard Summer School Program for more than ten years and in that time we have developed personal relationships with the Director of the Harvard University Summer School and his staff. These relationships are invaluable in ensuring that our young people are well supported while attending Harvard.

Can I apply to attend Harvard Summer School?

You are eligible to apply if you are:

- Currently attending school or college and plan to go on to further education.
- Aged 16-18: This age restriction is set by Harvard University, not Who Cares? Scotland. Applicants must be at least 16 years old by June 21, 2025, and will not turn 19 years old before July 31, 2025.
- Willing to be an ambassador for Who Cares? Scotland, through writing and speaking publicly about your experience.
- In possession of a valid, in-date passport and able to travel to the USA unaccompanied.
- Have lived experience of the care system. This could include foster care; secure care; kinship care; living at home and has a social worker; living in a residential unit or school; living with adoptive parents.

What will I gain?

- Valuable academic experience studying at a world-class university.
- Confidence to live and travel independently and build friendships with people from all over the world.
- The chance to share your experiences and inspire positive change for Care Experienced people.

What will Harvard Summer School be like?

Harvard University is the oldest educational institution in the United States. Summer School students come to study from all over the world. You will spend seven weeks living, dining, studying, and socialising. You will share a room with another Summer School student and three meals a day are provided in the Harvard dining halls. You will be taking two, four-credit university level courses which will be challenging. The need to study, take exams and attend classes will be a priority. You will also have opportunities to take part in social and sporting activities, explore Cambridge and Boston and perhaps even travel further afield. How can I apply?

We suggest that you read this document carefully, learn more about the <u>Secondary School Program</u> on the Harvard University website, then discuss the program with a supportive adult to determine if the Secondary School Program is the right opportunity for you.

If you would like to apply, please email harvard@whocaresscotland.org and we will send you the application form. You must send the completed application form, a copy of the photo page of your passport and a copy of your academic transcripts by REPLYING to the email we sent you. This will allow us to keep your data secure.

We will be holding online information sessions on Tuesday 24th of September at 6pm and Thursday 3rd of October at 5:30pm. If you would like to attend, please email us and we will send you a link.

The deadline for applications is 9am Monday 4th November 2024

Interviews will be held on Saturday 30th November 2024

Application

Sections 1-5: To be completed by the applicant. If the applicant is currently under 16, they will

also need consent from a parent/legal guardian.

Section 6: To be completed by a supporting adult, such as a social worker or throughcare

worker.

Section 7: This section must be completed by the supporting agency to confirm the

financial contribution that the supporting agency will make to secure the

application for the Harvard University Summer School Program.

Please list all academic qualifications already achieved and subjects/levels you are currently studying. We also require a copy of your academic transcripts. If you need copies of your SQA Certificates, you can request them here. This is free of charge for Care Experienced people aged 26 and under.

Section 3: Personal statement

You will need to write a personal statement about why you would like to take part in the Program, how you will benefit from it and what skills and qualities you have that will enable you to thrive in this environment. We are looking for bright, engaged young people who:

- will work hard academically
- will thrive in a university environment
- will cope well with travelling and living independently for 7 weeks
- have good social skills and are keen to get involved in the opportunities on offer
- are willing to share their experiences through public speaking and social media

Section 4: Short Essay Questions

You will need to answer a number of short essay questions.

Section 5: Consent & Signature

Selection process

Once the applications have been reviewed by staff at Who Cares? Scotland, successful applicants will be invited to attend an interview. The interviews will take place on Saturday 23rd November in the National Office in Glasgow. All applicants will be contacted by Friday 29th November to let them know whether they have been selected for an interview.

Our offer of support does not guarantee a place on the Harvard Summer School Program. Following the interviews, at least two candidates will be selected by Who Cares? Scotland. They will then need to apply directly to the Secondary School Program through an online application on the Harvard University Website no later than Wednesday 12th February 2025. Who Cares? Scotland will provide ample support to complete this process.

Will I have to pay any money towards my place?

- No personal financial contribution is required from the applicant.
- Total cost of the program per applicant is approximately £13,500.
- For the application to be considered by Who Cares? Scotland, the local authority or care provider
 must agree to contribute £5,500 to the costs of the program. Who Cares? Scotland will fund the
 remaining costs.
- The cost of the program includes: university tuition fees; all meals and accommodation in halls; F-1 Student Visa fees and Harvard visa processing fees; travel to Belfast to obtain F-1 Student Visa; US health insurance and travel insurance; return flights to Boston; book purchase for courses; immunisations*; and spending money.

^{*}Harvard University requires all students to provide proof of immunisations/immunity to MMR, Varicella (Chicken Pox), Tetanus-Diphtheria-Pertussis, Hepatitis B and Meningitis. COVID vaccinations are also mandatory. You can read more about the University's COVID policies here.
