Agenda items		
Welcome and Report from the Chair,	Sarah welcomed members to the AGM and talked about its purpose and what would happen over the course of the next half hour. Sarah also reminded member that we had recently appointed Carmel Jacob as Chair, following an internal recruitment process. Sarah invited Carmel to the stage to present her Report. Report from the Chair, Carmel Jacob The Chair of the Board presented an update on the activities of Who Cares? Scotland for the period April 2023-March 2023 which included the work to launch our new strategic plan in January. Other achievements included: Raising profile of importance of independent advocacy with key stakeholders including Scottish Government and Sheriff Mackie as he led on the review of the Children's Hearing System. Enhancement of our advocacy contract Children's Hearing Scotland retention of advocacy presence in all 32 local authorities with services 27. Over the period we supported around 1,800 people to raise over 5,500 advocacy issues. Continued provision of lifelong advocacy via Helpline, with average age of a caller being 24 years of age, supporting around 200 individuals with nearly 300 advocacy tasks Made connection and having fun one of our top priorities with over 750 people with Care Experience participating in our regular groups and activities. Celebrated the return of our in person national events.	

Minutes, Annual Accounts and Auditor Appointment	Secured major strategic partnership with the John Lewis Partnership with funds raised going towards connection and belonging activities for members. Annual Accounts for year ending 31.03.22

Fiona Donaldson, Director of Finance, reviewed the annual accounts for year ending 31.03.23. Highlights included:

- Income dropped to £4.6m due to drop in government funding linked to activity during Covid
- Expenditure increased slightly to £4.7m and is consistent with previous years
- We received a clean audit report
- We made progress in contributing to our reserves
- Balance sheet shows healthy reserves position

Resignations

3 Board members stepped down: Shaun Brittain, David Middleton, Kevin Timlin. This is in addition to former chair Ryan McCuaig who stepped down earlier in the year.

Trevor Hillman asked Carmel Jacob about how she felt, taking on the role of Chair of Who Cares? Scotland. Carmel said that she recognised that in taking over the role from Ryan, that she would have 'big boots to fill' but she was excited to get the chance to represent the community on the board. She said that becoming part of Who Cares? Scotland had been life-changing for her and she was exciting to give back to the organisation in the role of Chair.
